## **Membership Process & Expectations**

Rotary membership begins with an invitation. New members are typically sponsored by a current Rotarian and must demonstrate strong character, leadership in their profession or community, and a genuine commitment to service. We welcome individuals who are ready to roll up their sleeves, get involved, and contribute their time, talent, and resources to support the mission of Rotary.

Here's what you need to know as you begin this journey:

- Application Fee: A one-time \$100 application fee is due with your application.
- Annual Dues: Dues are \$360 per year, prorated based on the month you join. Our fiscal year runs
  July 1 June 30. You'll receive an invoice for the balance of your dues (minus application fee) upon
  approval by the Board.
- **Board Review**: Your application will be reviewed at the next Board of Directors meeting. If approved, our general membership has a 10-day period for feedback.
- Participation Encouraged: You're welcome to attend meetings and get involved while your application
  is pending.
- Weekly Meetings: We meet every Wednesday from Noon to 1:00 PM at the Century Center. You'll choose either a \$4 beverage or \$15 lunch (cash or credit).
- Financial Commitment: The typical annual cost of being a Rotarian is around \$600, which includes
  dues, weekly fines and optional contributions to Rotary causes. Financial giving is just one way to be
  engaged and involved in Rotary.
- Member Engagement and Service: From hands-on local projects to global initiatives, Rotary offers countless ways to make a difference. By actively engaging whether through club committees, service projects, weekly meetings, or social events you're not just showing up, you're investing in the strength and spirit of our club. Your involvement helps create a vibrant, welcoming community and ensures Rotary is a meaningful experience for everyone. Along the way, you'll discover opportunities to support causes close to your heart with your time, your expertise, and your generosity all while deepening your own Rotary journey.
